- CIVIL: no law is broken; a lawsuit over money, property, rights; FAMILY LAW (marriage, divorce, child custody, adoption).
- CRIMINAL: a law is broken; someone is charged, convicted, sentenced; a punishment is given (probation, fine, jail, or prison). Traffic offenses and accidents are criminal.
