→ The agenda are items on the party's platform that the President & members of the party support & try to get implemented into policy.



Bully Pulpit



- Coined by President Theodore Roosevelt.
- A platform where presidents can advocate for their agenda.
- Bully used to mean "superb" or "wonderful".










Endorsing Candidates in the modern era


